## Screen time solutions coming in April!

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How do we control screen time? We have learned that screen time (TV, I-pads and tablets, phones, computers, etc.) is the second leading cause of maladaptive behavior in our kiddos. Screen time changes the pathways in our brains — and in our kids' brains! It has social impacts, too. It is a part of our lives. Finding the healthy balance isn't easy. Children under two years of age may have up to 30 minutes of screen time but with a participatory parent interacting with the kiddo. If parents approve what they watch, elementary school age kids may enjoy up to an hour. Two hours per day is the most leisure screen time any of us should have, even as adults.

Where do we start? There will be a free screen time seminar on April 18 held at the River Center in Lebanon. They will be showing the movie "Screenagers." Experts will talk about how we can set healthy boundaries related to screen time. The event is free, but you need to register. You can call the office to sign up at 541-704-0221.




